MINUTES

July 9, 2018

Board met in regular session with Thomas Shuttlesworth, Ronald Paul and Harold Smith in attendance. Minutes of previous meeting and treasurer report were approved as submitted. Also in attendance were Martha Pluswick, Patty Ney, Luann Hoffman, Dennis Scheib, Penny Bush, Deann Devine, James Drum and Attorney Joseph Kerwin.

Ms Pluswick commented on the pending repair to the block wall on her property. She is concerned about the drainage pipe in the wall. Township will review when work starts on repair to the wall. Patty Ney requested permission to place veteran banners on the poles within the township; Board has no objections but recommended she contact PPL for proper placement. She also suggested a rumble strip on Grant Street exiting Laurel Hill. Board does not allow rumble strips on township roadways. Questions on the placement of tenants in Laurel Hill should be directed to Dauphin County Housing Authority.

Penny Bush requested a building permit for an above ground pool to be installed. Secretary will issue permit at a time agreed to Ms. Bush. Deann Devine stated that her neighbor property at 315 North St. is in unsafe condition to the neighbors. Secretary will review the property and determine if any violations to township ordinances exist.
